2. Travel & Subsistence €36,350 per annum;

This equates to €700 per week spent as follows,

1. Hotel Accommodation
2. Daily Subsistence
4. Travel of over 1,000 KM's per week

3. Public Representation Allowance €20,350 per annum

This allowance is used to run my Constituency office to serve my Constituents. It pays for rent, light, heat, phones, advertising etc. It is fully vouched and subject to audit, it is also managed by my Office staff. This money never enters my personal bank account.

Notes on the above:-

I work in excess of eighty hours every week. My take home pay is over €900 per week which equates to just over €10 per hour.

Travel & Subsistence is a monthly payment to cover the cost of living away from home during the week. In my case I had to purchase a second car, tax, insure and maintain it to cover over 1,000km's per week.

I did not stand for election for monetary gain. On election to Cork County Council in 2004, I resigned my position as Principal Teacher and committed to work full time as a County Councillor. I resigned my position in January 2005 allowing the School to employ a new Teacher. I have not received any pension or salary payment since that date. This job is no longer available to me and I have absolutely no job security in the event of losing my seat in the next or any subsequent election.

It is also noteworthy that TD's are the only public sector employees that cannot avail of increment payments and do not have job security.
